






(above) Revolutionary ceremonial dagger and sheath. Handle made of gold and silver; characteristic carved and incised silver hand guard; silver blade with a gold tip, used to draw blood during blood compacts and other secret ceremonies requiring the writing in blood by revolutionaries. Also used as a prominent symbol and ceremonial instrument in the most solemn masonic rites. (See: The Tragedy of the Revolution; Adrian E. Cristobal; 1997; pp. 48, 77).

This was the contemporary publication of the basic repository of history, philosophy, doctrines, rites, rituals, paraphernalia and practices used by freemasons of the time, as well as by many of the revolutionaries who adopted the beliefs, practices and secret signs, symbols and rituals used in the organization and operation of the Katipunan and other secret revolutionary societies.




(left) Gilt silver feather pen. Said to be from Bulacan or recovered there. Owner would appear to have written a literary work/novel "Heraclio and Aurora". On a piece of stationery is printed: "819 R. Hidalgo Street, Quiapo, Manila. Tel. 3-38-85". Gold nib not originally with the pen.

In the form of a feather, used in signing important documents of the time. Similar to the First Prize won by Jose Rizal for his literary work "A la Juventud Filipina" in an artistic literary contest in 1879. Anting – anting undershirt: Fully inscribed on all sides with Spanish, Latin and Tagalog mystical and other esoteric signs, symbols and encantations. Used by revolutionaries and religious devotees. 




Vuelta Grande: A long silver chain used by revolutionaries and religious devotees, suspending many crosses, religious medals and anting- anting, charms and amulets of religious, spiritual and revolutionary/ political nature, worn to protect a person from all related dangers and bring luck, protection or blessings to the owner. Of particular interest is the severed head of St. Paul said to belong to Emilio Jacinto. Anting-anting and masonic symbols figured prominently among the revolutionaries. 


